SECTION	1.	DEFINITIONS	

This ordinance shall be known as the "Bingo Licensing Ordinance and for the purposes of the ordinance, unless the context requires otherwise, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

- 2. "Bingo" or "game" shall mean and include a specific game of chance, commonly known as bingo or lotto, in which prizes are awarded on the basis of designated numbers or symbols on a card conforming to numbers or symbols selected at random.
- 3. "Authorized Organization" shall mean and include only bona fide religious, charitable or non-profit organizations of veterans, volunteer firemen and similar non-profit organizations.
- 4. "License" shall mean a license issued pursuant to the provisions of the ordinance.

#### SECTION 2 AUTHORIZATION.

It shall be lawful for any authorized organization, upon obtaining a license therefor, as hereinafter provided, to conduct the game of bingo within the territorial limits of the Village of Palmyra subject to the provisions of this ordinance, the provisions of Article 14-G (Sections 475-499) of the General Municipal Law and the provisions of the State Lottery Control Law as they may from time to time be amended.
