A special meeting of the Village Board called by President Weldon W. Shepard held Sunday January 4, 1953 at 3:00 P.M. in the Village Hall, Palmyra, New York.

Present: Mr. Weldon W. Shepard, President, Mr. Donald A. Dohse, Mr. James R. Webster, Mr. George W. Contant and Mr. Russell H. Fisk, Trustees.

The meeting was called to discuss the present situation in connection with the Police Department.

Mr. Harry White who has acted as Extra Patrolman for the past several months was asked to meet with the Board and to discuss with them the possibility of his appointment as a regular provisional patrolman.

After terms agreeable to the Village Board and to Mr. White, were reached,

Mr. Contant moved that Mr. Harry White be appointed as provisional Patrolman at a salary of \$ 60.00 per week for the balance of the Village year, seconded by Mr. Fisk, and on motion, carried.

Mr. Contant moved that Mr. Harold R. Scribner who has acted as extra patrolman for the Village for the past six or seven years, be appointed as a regular provisional patrolman effective on or about January 15th, 1953 at a salary of \$ 50.00 per week plus apartment, this motion seconded by Mr. Fisk, and carried.

Mr. Baxter was asked to appear before the Board and was advised of the aforesaid appointments and was also advised that for the present there would be no Patrolman-in Charge of the Department.

Mr. Baxter informed the Board that he could see no reason why the Department could not operate in a harmonious and satisfactory manner, under the new set-up.

No further business appearing the minutes were read and on motion by Mr. Fisk, seconded by Mr. Contant same were approved.

On motion by Mr. Dohse seconded by Mr. Webster, the meeting adjourned at 6.40 P.M.

They are also to be advised that the Fire Chief is to be consulted before any major purchases or repairs are to be made and that all equipment such as boots, coats, hats and all special equipment belonging to the department is under supervision of the Chief.

A letter received from Mr. Sidney Trumbull requesting a street light at the corner of Stafford & West Foster extension was ordered received and filed.

Mr. W.F. Farrell representative of Wallace & Tiernen Co. Inc. visited the Board and furnished figures as to cost of new chlorinator including installation. Mr. Webster moved that a new Wallace & Tiernen Chlorinator be purchased at a net cost of \$ 2,495.50 subject to approval of the voters of the village, seconded by Mr. Dohse, and on motion, carried.

The Budget for 1953 as presented by the Village Clerk was discussed by the members of the Board . It was decided that the Appropriation for salaries and maintenance of fire department be increased \$ 500.00 and the Appropriation for Insurance and Bonds be increased \$ 500.00. Proposition #1 to be presented to the voters at the April election calls for an appropriation of \$ 2,500.00 for the purchase of a new chlorinator. Proposition #2 calls for an appropriation of \$ 700.00 to purchase a tract of land for public dump. The total budget including propositions 1 & 2 amounts to \$ 74,134.55. Mr. Dohse moved that the budget for 1953 be approved at \$ 74,134.55, seconded by Mr. Webster, and on motion, carried.

No further business appearing the minutes were read and on motion by Mr. Fisk, seconded by Mr. Contant, same were approved.

Mr. George W. Contant was authorized to furnish Mr. Bennett with this information and to advise Mr. Tabor of Mr. Bennett's decision.

Applications for Water service received from John F. Rolland at property located at lot 26, Hyde Parkway and Robert W. Keller on Howell Street were approved.

The Clerk was instructed to write to Mr. Burger, Manager of N.Y. Telephone Company and request that he issue the following orders to his Palmyra Operators. When a fire is reported to the Palmyra Office, the first duty of the Operator is to blow the fire whistle. On working days (Monday thru Friday) after whistle has been blown the Operator will please call the switch board Operator at Garlock Factory, giving her as much information as possible as to location of fire, type of fire whether dwelling, barn property in business section, grass fire or fire outside of corporation. During night after blowing fire whistle call Chief Roger L. Powers and if no response call James O'Brien, John Mouton or Everitt Merritt. The three above named are Assistant Fire Chiefs in order named and when one is contacted it will not be necessary to call the others.

When the above instructions are completed Mr. German of the Water Department should be called on both day and night fires, no drivers are to be called.

The Clerk was instructed to order 5 Fire brooms from W.J. Lawless, Elmire, N. Y.

The Clerk was instructed to write the Sales Manager of the Gamewell Company and advise them that the Village Board is very much dissatisfied with the results they are getting from the new fire horn and request that an experienced representative of their Company come to Palmyra and contact Mr. Roger L. Powers Fire Chief, and see what changes can be made to improve the present condition.

A motion by Mr. Contant, seconded by Mr. Webster that the purchase of the property now owned by Francis J. McGuire having been approved at the annual election, the Village Attorney be authorized to complete the purchase of this property, and that the Clerk and Treasurer be and they hereby are authorized to draw on the General Special Fund \$ 800.00 to complete such purchase.

Mr. Webster moved that Mr. Robert McCall of Macedon, N.Y. be awarded the contract to spray elm trees in the Village of Palmyra at the rate of .74 per tree, seconded by Mr. Contant and on motion, carried.

The Clerk was authorized to transfer \$ 3,000. from General Special Fund to Highway Account.

No further business appearing, the minutes were read and on motion by Mr. Jeffery, seconded by Mr. Fisk same were approved.
