- Shopkeepers in the commercial block on Main Street will have the first option of using their sidewalk space during pageant week.
- Shopkeepers may choose not to have a vendor located on the sidewalk in front of ri
- If two vendors request the same sidewalk location, the one with the earlier permit application date will get the space. 3
  - Shopkeepers may not sublet their space. 4.
- Applications for permits will not be accepted more than 45 days prior to the event for which they are requested. (For July 2000, the first day an application may be accepted will be the day Local Law #1, 2000 goes on file with the State.) Specifications for vendor booths are as follows:
