Present: Mayor David M. Nussbaumer, and Board of Trustees David McGuire, Paul Mierke, Donald Sinclair and Donald Leysath.

Vouchers: Motion by Trustee Leysath, 2nd by Trustee McGuire and carried to approve payment of the vouchers as presented.

Dr.Bramer: Dr. James D. Bramer, Health Officer of the Village of Palmyra, discussed with the Village Board the problem of Laurentian Drive. Dr. Bramer advised that the only way that it can be proved that an unsanitary condition exists on Laurentian Drive is to get actual effluent samples. The following motion was made by Trustee Sinclair, 2nd by Trustee Leysath and carried:-

> If Mr. DePauw does not comply with the instruc-Resolved: tions in the letter to remove the tree by; the time allowed, the clerk is to contact the Empire Tree Surgeons, Newark, New York to order them to remove the tree, billing the Village of Palmyra for removal, followed by a statement to Mr. DePauw for the removal of the tree, to repay the village.

Dump:

Trustee Sinclair informed the Village Board that the Village of Palmyra Dump on Garnsey Road is improving. Norm Everdyke of Macedon, has worked with a D-8 Bulldozer at \$30.00 per hour to push the debris over the bank, levelling to form a sloped plateau. Following this, it would be his suggestion that deep trenches, one at a time be dug with fence so placed to encourage the user to dump only in the "pocket" provided. Fill could then be placed over the daily accumulation to completely cover the area. Trustee Sinclair further suggested that a letter be sent to the Town of Palmyra so informing them that it would be apropos for them to pay 1/2 of the expense of the bulldozer equipment needed at this time. A further comment by Trustee Sinclair indicated that it is hoped that an exit may be made available at the lower end of the dump.

Nesbitt, to prepare the necessary legal papers to file with the State of New York to make a Utility Tax a Local Law in the Village of Palmyra.

Roche-Kim- A discussion of a letter received from Roche-Kimberly relative to their suggestion and opinion of changing the village zoning ordinance which relates to Nursing Homes was voiced by all board members. Attorney Nesbitt commented that; in his opinion, the board, by changing the ordinance or zoning, could reasonably change the look of an R--l District by allowing a nursing home anyplace here rather than by requesting a Special Permit. (His reference was the possibility of someone buying two or three homes, demolishing, and then building a nursing home on the land.)

Resolved: Whereas there is a vacancy on the Planning Board, and whereas Jay Wiley, Tremont Street has indicated that he would be interested in serving on this board, be it resolved that he be so appointed.

Resolved: That the clerk contact the Geneva Tent and Awning Company, Geneva, N.Y. to inquire about a new flag for the Village Hall pole, and so purchase one at this time.

Of the 22 Motor Vehicle arrests, 7 were for speeding, with other infractions listed as unsafe tires, unlicensed operators, no inspection stickers, illegal parking, driving while intoxicated, no insurance. Fines and bail forfeitures amounted to \$112.00 and parking meter fines \$37.00.
