The report of Cemetery collections in amount \$121.25 was ordered received and filed.

The application received from Mr. William Deys, Sec. of Palmyra Steamer and Hose Co., Inc. requesting approval of J. Donald Roe for membership in said Company to replace Doctor C.C. Nesbitt was approved, and the Clerk was directed to advise Mr. Deys accordingly.

The report received from Mr. Henry Nesbitt, Police Justice, covering fines and forfeits for the month of April in amount of \$150.00 was ordered filed.

A letter received from Mr. George L. Abbott advising the Board that the Garlock Packing Company would honor an invoice in amount of \$2700.00 representing a voluntarily accepted additional charge on account of water service during the Village's fiscal year ended, March 31st., 1953, and that a like additional charge might be made at end of this fiscal year March 31st., 1954. The letter stated that it was to be understood that the above payments are voluntary and discretionary on the part of the Company and that the terms of their contract made on September 20th., 1935 stand unchanged.

Mr. Webster moved that three oak chairs be purchased from Mr. Gene McGuire for use in Justice rooms, seconded by Mr. Contant, motion carried.

Mr. Fisk moved that the hourly rate of the extra patrolman be increased to \$1.25 an hour, seconded by Mr. Jeffery and on motion carried.

The Clerk was instructed to write to Mr. Kenneth D. Burnham and advise that the Village Board had considered his proposed street proposition and that they would be unable to give him

any approval at this time. Mr. Burnham was also to be advised that before the Board would be able to consider this matter further, it is suggested that he take up with the Town Board of the Town of Macedon, the idea of having the Town of Macedon consent to moving the present Town Line westerly to your west line and have the Village of Palmyra line move westerly to your west line. This would place your entire land within the Village of Palmyra. It has been brought to the attention of the Board, that Mr. Monroe may have a right to pass over your land to the west of his vacant lot. Land can not be accepted for a public street or highway, unless it is free and clear of all claims, liens and ect.

While the Board of Trustees desires to cooperate in all projects for the benefit of the Village of Palmyra and it's citizens, Village funds can not be spent for private projects. Mr. Burnham was also to be advised that this letter is not a permit on the part of the Village of Palmyra, that it can or will accept such proposed street as you may in the future offer to dedicate.

When you have some definite proposition to submit, the Board of Trustees will be glad to give it consideration.

The Clerk was directed to reply to a letter received from Mr. Charles C. McClelland Sec. of the Palmyra Chamber of Commerce and advise him that the Board has instructed the Highway foreman at the previous meeting of April 21st., that Main street, especially the business section was to be flushed at least once a month during the summer months.

The Clerk was directed to write to Mr. John Stephan #1 Engine House, Lyons, N.W. and advise that the Village Board were not in a position to proceed with the purchase of a tank truck at a cost of about \$20,000.00 so would not be eligible for the re-imbursement of \$6000.00 allowed by State Aid.

A letter received from Mr. John C. Haberer District Sanitary Engineer, under date of May 4th., 1953 was referred to Mr. German for investigation and report.

An application received from Mr. Howard Van Bortle, S.D requesting water service on Hyde Park was approved by the Village Board.

An application for replacement of side walk was received from Mr. James D. Farrell, 102 Vienna street, Palmyra, N. Y, same was approved and the clerk was directed to advise Mr. Farrell by letter that the highway department would install a new walk but same could not be done until repairs on Village streets had been completed,

Application for a permit to connect cellar drain to storm sewer was received from Mr. Leroy Leroy Nussbaumer and same was approved.

No further business appearing, the minutes were read and on motion by Mr. Jeffery, seconded by Mr. Fisk, same were approved.

WHEREAS, due to the construction of the Thruway by the State of New York across the water line owned and operated by the Village of Palmyra for the purpose of conducting water from Canandaigua Lake to the Village of Palmyra, it has become necessary for this village to reconstruct its water line under and across the Thruway; and

WHEREAS, to assure an uninterrupted flow of water, it is necessary to connect the old line with the new line now in the process of construction at the Thruway on either side of the Thruway; and

WHEREAS, this Board of Trustees has been advised by competent engineers that the most practicable and desirable solution of connecting the old line and the new line being constructed is to extend the new line northerly about 500 feet from the north end of the new line as now constructed and to extend the new line southerly about 1130 feet from the south end of the new line as now constructed, such extensions to be 20inch cast iron pipe; and

WHEREAS, time is of the essence of this project, and a public emergency must be averted; be it





RESOLVED that this village reconstruct the water pipe line for a distance of about 500 feet north from the north end of the new line now being constructed, and for a distance of about 1130 feet south from the south end of the present new line, using 20-inch cast iron cement-lined pipe, and for the purpose of carrying out and completing such project, that the necessary materials be purchased at once, that such additional easements be acquired as may be necessary, and that such project be carried on and completed at once by the employees of this village.
