WHEREAS, the present water rents and charges of this village have not been increased since 1915, although all expense entering into the operation of the municipal water system have increased by substantial amounts, and the village has obtained a new source of water in the meantime at a cost of over one-third of a million dollars, and the water system has been operating at a loss for several years,

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra, New York, by virtue of the power and authority given them by the Charter of said village and the laws of the State of New York, do hereby enact, ordain and declare the following to be amendments to the rules, regulations and rates heretofore adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra, as ordinances of said village.

Sections 21, 23 and 24 of the ordinances, rules, regulations, rates and scale of water rents approved and adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra, New York, on the 31st day of December, 1914, are hereby amended and each and every part of said sections inconsistent with these amendments are hereby repealed.

Sections 21, 23 and 24 of said ordinances are hereby reenacted as amended and made to read as follows:

Section 21. Bills for Water Rents in accordance with scale of Water Rents as established by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra, New York, and bills for any other service rendered, will be rendered on March 1st, June 1st, September 1st and December 1st of each year and must be paid on or before the 10th day of such month at the office of the Water Cashier, or such other official as the Board of Trustees may designate or

appoint. If such bill is not paid by the 10th day of the month of rendering, a ten per cent penalty will be added, and if said bill shall not be paid by the 1st day of the month succeeding the date of rendering, notice will be given of failure to pay, and in case same is not then paid within ten days, the water shall be turned off until the bill and penalty is paid. A charge of \$3.00 will be made for turning the water on after same have been shut off for failure to pay, and said charge must be pa when application is made to have water turned on.

Section 23. Water Rents are hereby established as follows:

Consumers shall pay water rents for the quarter beginni
December 1st, 1950, or any part thereof, at the existing rates.

From and after March 1st, 1951, the Water Rents shall and same hereby are fixed and established as follows, viz:

Quarterly Water Rates

First 5000 gallons at 60¢ per 1000 gallons

Next 10000 gallons at 50¢ per 1000 gallons

Next 40000 gallons at 40¢ per 1000 gallons

All over 55000 gallons at 30¢ per 1000 gallons

Minimum rate for each quarter or part thereof \$2.50

Water rents for all consumers outside of the Village of Palmyra shall be double the rates for consumers inside the Village of Palmyra, unless such consumers are in an organized water district, when the rates fixed by contract shall prevail.

Section 24. The Ordinances, Rules, Regulations heretofore and on December 31st, 1914, duly adopted by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Palmyra, New York, shall remain in full force and effect except as heretofore amended or amended by the foregoing ordinances, rules and regulations.
