APPROVAL OF ABSTRACT: Motion by Trustee Celentano, second by Trustee Palmer to approve payment of Abstract #3, for vouchers 174 - 237 for \$174,844.26. Vote, 4 ayes. CARRIED.

TRUSTEE REPORTS:

Trustee Piccola reported that the last movie in the park will be *Daddy Daycare* on Friday, September 9th. The Community Garage Sale will be October 2nd, registration forms are available in Village Hall but must be turned into Beth Bradley at Kavanaugh Books. The hours for the sale are 8:00 am to noon.

Trustee Celentano reported that the highway continues to work on sidewalks through out the Village. Superintendent Cook will be working on the trail from Maple to Aqueduct Park, weather permitting. Trustee Celentano reported that the 1987 pickup truck used for leaf pickup and snow removal has developed an oil leak. The repair should run \$2500 to \$3500. The Board discussed several options and decided to ask Nelson to look into leasing options for a new truck.

PT Freund's request for an additional fire hydrant and the condition of the existing fire hydrant was discussed at length. The Board decided to have all parties involved come to the next Board meeting to facilitate a solution. Those being asked to attend will be Nelson Cook, Richard Clayton and PT. Freund.

Attorney Williams reported that the changes made to the easement submitted by CDS were insignificant and advised Mayor to sign same.

Mayor Daly briefly recapped her written report. She urged the Board to review the recent NYCOM update regarding upcoming legislation.

Trustee Palmer reported that the new retaining wall in the cemetery should be completed this week. The exterior painting of Village Hall and the Park and Club Rooms will not be completed as planned mostly due to the amount of mowing needed this year. Fire Dept. — Trustee Palmer reported that Garlock has not been submitting their hazardous material reports. Until they do, if a call comes in, the Fire Department will respond but only as far as the front gate. Trustee Palmer moved to accept Lesley Ann Burger for membership in the Fire Department pending the appropriate training and a satisfactory physical. Second by Trustee Celentano. Vote, 4 ayes. CARRIED.

Trustee Palmer noted that the pancake breakfasts will begin once again on September 26th at the Fire Hall and that the low interest loan from the State has come through; the interim financing can be paid off.

NEW/OLD BUSINESS:

<u>CAMPING IN THE PARK:</u> Motion was made by Trustee Celentano, second by Trustee Palmer to approve the request from Scoutmaster Nichols, Boy Scout Troop 66, for camping in the Village Park, September 24 – September 26. Vote, 4 ayes. CARRIED.

PARKING IN THE VILLAGE: The Board heard from Stafford Street resident Steve Knapp regarding tractor trailer parking on Village streets. He submitted a petition asking the Board to pass an ordinance prohibiting the parking of tractor trailers and commercial trailers on residential streets. The residents are concerned for the safety of anyone exiting their driveway. There is no visibility around the trailers. The Board discussed their request as well as the request from E. Hartnagel last month to make Stafford no parking on either side from the Community Center driveway to Foster. The Board decided to invite all the residents from the south end of Stafford to voice their opinion before scheduling a public hearing for the local law that would be required. Attorney Williams will prepare the local law for the Board to review. Market Street will be addressed in that local law as well.

<u>SIDEWALK MAINTENANCE:</u> The Board asked Attorney Williams to draft better wording for the sidewalk maintenance ordinance. The way is stands right now it would be very hard to enforce.

<u>COUNTY MITIGATON PLAN:</u> Tabled until Highway Superintendent Cook schedule clears.

207C CONFERENCE: Mayor Daly asked the Board to review the draft of the 207-C policy/procedure for discussion at the next Board meeting. Trustee Salomon asked that we share a copy of Scott Seltzer, the union representative as well.

COMPUTEL: Trustee Palmer moved to adopt the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the New York State Public Service Commission instituted formal proceedings to consider the past billings and other issues, claims or disputes in connection with the rendition of street lighting service by New York State Electric & Gas Corporation ("NYSEG"); and

WHEREAS, the Village of Palmyra intervened in such proceedings; and

WHEREAS, Village of Palmyra engaged Computel Consultants ("Computel") as its authorized representative in regard to all issues, claims or disputes pertaining to street lighting services rendered by NYSEG to the Village of Palmyra, including, but not limited to, its past NYSEG street lighting bills; and

WHEREAS, negotiations between NYSEG and Computel have resulted in a settlement and release agreement between NYSEG and the Village of Palmyra; and

WHEREAS, Computel has recommended the acceptance of such settlement and release agreement.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Mayor Victoria W. Daly is authorized and directed to execute a settlement and release agreement with and to deliver the same to NYSEG. The settlement and release agreement is an accord and satisfaction for all issues, claims or disputes pertaining to street lighting services rendered by NYSEG to the Village of Palmyra from the beginning of such services through and including July 3 1, 2000.

Second by Trustee Celentano. Vote, 4 ayes. CARRIED.

BE IT RESOLVED that the sale of "Poppers" (throwable fireworks), stink bombs and liquid string during any parade in the Village of Palmyra be prohibited and further that the sale or use of at or during CanalTown Days is hereby prohibited.

Be it further resolved that that Bicycles, skateboards, and roller blades be prohibited during CanalTown Days on Main Street between the intersections of Canandaigua/Church Streets and Fayette/Market St., the Display and Vendor areas and the Palmyra Elementary School grounds.

Be it further resolved that animals including but not limited to dogs and snakes be prohibited during CanalTown Days in these same areas. This restriction shall not apply to "seeing eye" guide dogs.

The motion was seconded by Trustee Piccola. Vote, 4 ayes. CARRIED.

PARK & CLUB ROOMS: Additional items are needed in the policy for usage of the Park & Club rooms. The Board agreed that hours of operation should run from 9:00 am to 10 p.m., rooms will be reserved on a first come first served, calendar-year basis with twenty four hours notice preferred. Motion by Trustee Celentano, second by Trustee Piccola to adopt the proposed additions for usage of the Park & Club Rooms. Vote, 4 ayes. CARRIED. Trustee Palmer asked that no more reservations be taken for the upstairs room until a fire escape is installed.

SENIOR CITIZEN TAX EXEMPTIONS: Mayor Daly asked the Board to review the paperwork associated with senior citizen exemptions from the assessor's office for discussion on October 4th.

Motion by Trustee Salomon, second by Trustee Piccola to enter executive session at 8:05 p.m. for possible litigation. Vote, 4 ayes. CARRIED.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Motion by Trustee Piccola, second by Trustee Celentano to re-enter public session with no action having been taken at 8:15 p.m.. Vote, 4 ayes. CARRIED.
