Chapter 88

DUMPING, TRESPASSING AND OPEN FIRES

§ 88-1. Trespassing prohibited.

Trespassing upon public and/or private property within this Village is hereby prohibited.

§ 88-2. Dumping restricted on public property.

The placing, dumping or leaving of any glass, nails or other destructive matter, garbage, rubbish, filth, any inflammable or explosive matter, or any petroleum product, except as petroleum products shall be applied for road building or improvement purposes under the direction of the Superintendent of Highways of said Village, or any other waste or rubbish of any kind, on any street, square, sidewalk, crosswalk, lane, alley, property owned by or public place within the limits of this Village, is hereby prohibited; provided, however, that this prohibition shall not apply to the dumping of ashes or nonoffensive, noninflammable waste products upon property owned by the Village, provided such act shall be pursuant to the permission duly granted by resolution duly adopted by the Board of Trustees of this Village.

§ 88-3. Dumping on private property.

The placing, dumping or leaving of any garbage, rubbish, filth, any inflammable or explosive matter or any petroleum product, or any other waste or rubbish of any kind, upon property within this Village, other than public property, except as same is produced upon the premises where same is so placed, is hereby prohibited.

§ 88-4. Bonfires prohibited.

Willfully setting fire to, or permitting or assisting another to set fire to, any leaves, brush or rubbish of any kind within the bounds of this Village, either upon his own land or lands of another, whereby the property of another is injured or endangered, is hereby prohibited.

§ 88-5. Dumping grounds to be approved.

No public dump or dumping ground shall be maintained within the corporate limits of the Village of Palmyra, except and unless same shall be authorized by resolution duly adopted by the Board of Trustees of this Village.

§ 88-6. Penalties for offenses.¹

Any person who shall violate any provision of this chapter shall be punishable, upon conviction, by a fine not exceeding \$250 or a term of imprisonment not exceeding 15 days, or both, for each violation. Each day that such violation is permitted to exist shall constitute a separate violation.
