APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Motion by Trustee Celentano, second by Trustee Piccola, to approve the minutes from August 4, 2003 as submitted. Vote, 3 ayes. CARRIED.

TRUSTEE REPORTS: Trustee Piccola moved to name Iain Gellatly to Chair of the Planning Board to fill the vacancy left by William Unterborn. Second was made by Trustee Celentano. Vote, 3 ayes. CARRIED.

To fill Mr. Gellatly's vacancy, Trustee Piccola moved to appoint David Morrell to the Planning Board, his term to expire as Mr. Gellatly's would have. Second by Trustee Celentano. Vote 3 ayes. CARRIED.

For the Economic Support Group, Trustee Piccola reported the new Christmas decorations have been ordered for the new light poles in the business district.

Trustee Celentano reported that work along the new trail continues by the highway department and brush pickup will resume on September 8th.

Trustee Palmer reported that the turn out gear needs to be let out to bid. Although the equipment will be leased, the terms of procurement policy still prevail. And the fire alarm may be fixable after all.

Attorney Williams – arrived after reports.

Mayor Daly reviewed her written report. Mayor Daly explained that the Tourism Committee would like to use the Village artwork for a new brochure to be used by the merchants. Motion by Trustee Celentano, second by Trustee Piccola, to permit the Tourism Committee to use the Village artwork. Vote, 3 ayes. CARRIED.

The only solution the Chief can see is to restrict overnight parking in the entire Village for the whole year. Several Board members felt this was too extreme, although they did not have a solution either. The Board will discuss again after some thought.
